- 1. Mark the Oval to the left of the name of your choice.
- 2. To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, print the name clearly in the box labeled "Write-in", staying within the box.
- 3. To vote on a question or proposal, mark the oval below your choice.
- 4. Any mark or writing outside the spaces provided for voting may void the entire ballot.
- 5. You have a right to a replacement ballot. If you make a mistake or want to change your vote, call the Board of Elections at (585) 815-7804 for instructions on how to obtain a new ballot.
- 6. The number of choices is listed for each contest.
- 7. Do not mark the ballot for more candidates than allowed. If you do, your vote in that contest will not count.

HOW TO RETURN MILITARY BALLOT

- 1. After marking the ballot, fold such ballot and enclose it in the envelope bearing the voter's statement, and seal the envelope.
- 2. Fill in properly the blanks in the statement and sign your name.
- 3. Enclose the sealed envelope bearing the Statement in the envelope addressed to the Board of Elections and mail promptly.
- 4. The ballot of the military voter must be postmarked by the day of the election and received by the Board of Elections not later than 13 days following the day of the election to be cast and counted.
