FOURTH DAY GENESEE COUNTY LEGISLATURE Batavia, New York Wednesday, February 26, 2020

The Genesee Legislature met in Regular Session on Wednesday, February 26, 2020 at 5:30PM at the Old Courthouse 7 Main Street, Batavia, New York. Legislator Dibble conducted the audit. Prayer was offered by Legislator Young followed by the Pledge to the Flag.

Minutes of the February 12, 2020 Legislature meeting were approved upon motion of Legislator Hilchey seconded by Legislator Dibble, carried unanimously.

Committee and Special Assignment Reports: Legislator Maha and Clattenburg attended WNY Inter County Association monthly meeting at Houghton College, Allegany County. Assemblyman Joe Gilio described the state budget process. Also discussed was the Governor's proposal pertaining to the Medicaid Cap and the significant costs counties will be left to bear if his proposal goes through. Chair Stein stated the US Census complete count committee had a meeting this week and voted to support an application from Community Action to assist with providing services and activities to increase Census completion rates among hard to reach populations. She further explained there will be volunteer opportunities with increasing awareness and helping residents complete and submit Census documentation.

The following out-of-state travel requests were presented:

Out of state travel request-dispatcher Robert Tripp/Sheriff's Office to Orlando, FL for Tyler Connects Conference April 26-29, 2020 cost to the County \$2,791. Motion to approve by Legislator Clattenburg seconded by Legislator Maha, carried unanimously.

Out-of-state travel request Highway Superintendent Tim Hens to Washington DC for NACE Exec Comm Mtg & NACo Legislative Conference February 26-29, no additional cost \$0. Motion to approve by Legislator Yunker seconded by Legislator Hilchey, carried unanimously.

Out-of-State travel request Highway Superintendent Tim Hens to Las Vegas, NV for CONEXPO March 10-14, no additional cost \$0. Motion to approve by Legislator Clattenburg seconded by Legislator Maha, carried unanimously.

County Manager Jay Gsell reported that he represented Genesee County at the NYSAC sponsored Lobby Day in Albany held on February 12, 2020. He commented that educating county residents about the Census and encouraging participation will be emphasized for the next few months. Mr. Gsell announced he is retiring August 14, 2020 after working in government for 45 years, 27 as county manager. He further shared the succession plan outlined by the Legislature to appoint Assistant County Manager Matt Landers to county manager upon his retirement. Mr. Gsell commented that his work as county manager is considered government work however he thinks it is all about people, not necessarily buildings or projects. He is the second person to hold the position of county manager.

Legislator Yunker offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The District Attorney has requested an amendment to the 2020 County Budget to allow for utilization of a portion of the forfeiture crime funds in the amount of \$2,100.00 and the Committees on Public Service and Ways & Means concur. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2020 Genesee County Budget by increasing District Attorney Appropriation

A1165.2010.0020 Desk in the amount of \$1,639.00 and A1165.2010.0019 Bookcase in the amount of \$461.00 to be offset by an increase in District Attorney Revenue A1165.2626 Forfeiture of Crimes in the amount of \$2,100.00.

Budget Impact Statement: Increased expense for the District Attorney's 2020 budget of \$2,100.00 which is totally offset by using funds allocated for the District Attorney's Office in a Forfeiture of Crimes proceeds.

Legislator Young seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 73 2020 CENSUS OUTREACH GRANT APPLICATION-PLANNING DEPARTMENT-APPROVAL OF

Legislator Hilchey offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Genesee County Department of Planning has been notified of the availability of grant funding in the amount of \$84,558 from New York State for outreach to hard-to-count populations in the 2020 Census in Genesee County, and

WHEREAS, A signed Grant Disbursement Agreement is a requirement of the grant application, and

WHEREAS, The Genesee County 2020 Census Complete County Committee recommended the County apply for this grant and the county attorney has reviewed the agreement, and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Public Service did review this request and does concur. Now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee Legislature does hereby authorize the Legislature Chair to execute such documents as are deemed necessary to apply for the county census grant.

Budget Impact: Amendments to the Planning Dept. Budget will be required and expected in a separate resolution with grant acceptance and contract with service provider. No net county cost. Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 74 GENESEE/FINGER LAKES REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL BUDGET - FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR 2020 -APPROVAL OF

Legislator Dibble offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Section 239c of Article 12b of the General Municipal Law authorizes that governing bodies of participating municipalities in a regional or metropolitan planning agency may collaborate with other local governments to appropriate and raise by taxation money for the expenses of such regional Planning Boards, and

WHEREAS, The Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council has formally notified this Legislature that, under its proportional funding formula, Genesee County's 2020 share will be \$9,970 and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Public Service does recommend approval of payment of Genesee County's share at this time. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Legislature does hereby authorize continued participation in the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council and does hereby authorize and direct the County Treasurer to effect payment in the sum of \$9,970 as appropriated in the 2020 Budget, Account A8025.4660.0000.

Budget Impact: The 2020 Genesee County Budget appropriated \$9,970.00 for Contractual Services with the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council (Account A8025.4660.0000

Contracted-Other). This amount has remained unchanged for the last eighteen years. The Annual Report from G/FLRPC has historically shown a significant "return" for this investment. Legislator Maha seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 75 OFFICIAL UNDERTAKING OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES FIDELITY (BLANKET) BOND FOR GENESEE/FINGER LAKES REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL - APPROVAL OF

Legislator Yunker offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The County of Genesee has appropriated the sum of \$9,970 as its share of the 2020 operating funds of the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council, and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 119-00 of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, the County is authorized to provide for the payment of such appropriations to an officer of the agency designated by the agency to receive such monies provided that such officer shall have executed an official undertaking approved by the governing body of the County, and

WHEREAS, The Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council has designated David S. Zorn, Executive Director of the Council, as the officer to receive payments of such monies, and

WHEREAS, The Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council has secured a Public Employees Fidelity (Blanket) Bond, issued by National Grange Mutual Insurance Company, providing faithful performance blanket bond coverage for officers and employees of the Council in the amount of \$500,000, and the Committee on Public Service does recommend approval at this time. Therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Legislature hereby approves such bond as the official undertaking required pursuant to Section 119-00 of the General Municipal Law.

Budget Impact: The 2020 Genesee County Budget appropriated \$9,970.00 for Contractual Services with the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council (Account A8025.4660.0000 Contracted-Other). This amount has remained unchanged for the last eighteen years. The Annual Report from G/FLRPC has historically shown a significant "return" for this investment. Legislator Deleo seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

WHEREAS, Funds are available in the K-9 Donations Reserve Account, from the gifts and donations that have been made to the K9 Program, to cover these costs, and

WHEREAS, The Committees on Public Service and Ways and Means did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2020 budget as follows:

\$17,780 to A3110.4800.3317 (Program Exp-Canine Program)

\$7,220 to A3110.4340.0000 (Vehicle Maintenance and Repair)

To be offset by increasing the following revenue account:

\$25,000 to A3110.2705 (Gifts and Donations), with funds to come from A915.6 (K-9 Assigned Unappropriated Funds)

Budget Impact Statement: Increase in Sheriff's 2020 appropriations in the amount of \$25,000; offset by an increase in revenue in a like amount. Funds will come from the K9 Donations Reserve Account.

Legislator Dibble offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Genesee County requested a Next-Generation 9-1-1 digital voice recording system maintenance agreement from The Wilmac Company, who is currently on New York State Contract and our current digital voice recorder vendor per Resolution 343, dated September 28, 2017, and

WHEREAS, Our current maintenance contract expires February 28, 2021, and

WHEREAS, Genesee County received a NYS Statewide Interoperable Communications Grant which included funds for radio system maintenance, including recording systems, and

WHEREAS, The Wilmac Company provided a three-year service contract with an annual cost of \$29,300 per New York State OGS Contract, and

WHEREAS, Both parties agreed to adjust the commencement date to January 1, 2021, in order to align with SICG funding, and

WHEREAS, After careful review, the Genesee County Sheriff, County Attorney, and Director of Emergency Communications recommend the County amend the digital voice recorder maintenance agreement with The Wilmac Company located at 73 State Street, Rochester, NY 14614, at a cost not to exceed \$29,300 per year for the period of January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2023, and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Public Service did review this request and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

HIGHWAY DEDICATION – CALL PARKWAY (CR#53) -- APPROVAL OF

Legislator Young offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Genesee County Economic Development Center did develop a roadway into the Gateway II Business Park according to County Specifications, and

WHEREAS, The roadway had been constructed and complete to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Highways, and

WHEREAS, A proposed legal description of the right-of-way to be dedicated has been established by a Licensed Surveyor, and

WHEREAS, The Superintendent of Highways did inspect the roadway, review the proposed legal description, and recommends dedication of the highway and its right-of-way at this time, and

WHEREAS, The Public Service Committee has reviewed the recommendation of the County Highway Superintendent and concurs with it at this time. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Legislature does hereby dedicate the right-of-way delineated as follows:

All that tract or parcel of land, situate in the Town of Batavia, County of Genesee, State of New York, being a part of Lots 7 and 8 of Section 14, Township 12, Range 1 of the Holland Land Purchase and being a part of Parcel "B" as shown on a map of the "M.J. Budget Impact: The costs for maintaining the road and associated right-of-way shall be included in the County Road Fund. 2020 costs for snowplowing are approximately \$6,500 per mile and the costs for summer mowing and shoulder maintenance are \$465 per mile. The roadway is approximately .33 miles in length. Preventative maintenance will be not required on the roadway for several years.

ESTABLISH CAPITAL PROJECT AND APPROVAL OF FEDERAL AID MASTER AGREEMENT/ BUDGET AMENDMENT – MCCLERNON RD OVER BLACK CREEK – PIN 4GN0.03 – APPROVAL OF

Legislator Torrey offered the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 85

WHEREAS, a Project for the McClernon Road over the Black Creek Bridge Replacement, Town of Bethany, P.I.N. 4GN0.03 (the "Project"), County of Genesee is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs such program to be borne at the ration of 80% Federal Funds and 20% Local Match; and

WHEREAS, Genesee County desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of the total project, Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Legislature does hereby approve all future supplemental agreements to the federal aid master agreement for the Project; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Legislature hereby authorizes the Chairperson to pay in the first instance 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the cost of the Project or portions thereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, that in the event the full federal and non-federal share costs of the project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Genesee County Legislature shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the New York State Department of Transportation thereof, and it is further

WHEREAS, Video Lottery Terminal (VLT) revenue in the Genesee County Budget is an important source of revenue within the General (A) Fund along with property taxes and sales tax, and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of New York in his proposed budget has recommended that Video Lottery Revenue for host municipalities such as Genesee throughout New York State, with the exception of Yonkers, be terminated, and

WHEREAS, If the Governor's budget as proposed is adopted the County will lose \$200,392 in VLT revenue in the tax year 2021, and

WHEREAS, a revenue loss of that magnitude would result in a general County tax rate increase of \$0.064/\$1,000 and would consume 26% of our tax cap compliant growth cap levy, and

WHEREAS, a property owner who owns property with an assessed valuation of \$100,000 would pay \$64.00 more per year simply in order to keep the same level of services that the property owner currently enjoys, and

WHEREAS, the Governor's proposed elimination of this revenue stream would offer no reimbursement to the County of Genesee for the significant expenses it incurs in conjunction with hosting the Batavia Downs Racino, and

WHEREAS, normal inflationary pressures upon the budget, notwithstanding, the County would be forced to raise A fund taxes to a level that would be intolerable, and

WHEREAS, alternatively the County would be forced to consider substantial cuts in Countywide, non-mandated services, the number of employees and employee benefits to offset this significant loss in revenue, Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the County of Genesee categorically opposes the elimination of the Video Lottery Terminal revenue, and, Be it Further

RESOLVED, that the maintenance of the sum of \$200,392 must be sustained in order to preserve the standard of living and the quality of life that the citizens/tax payers of Genesee have every right to expect, and, Be it Further

RESOLVED, that Clerk Certified copes of this resolution shall be sent to the Governor of the State of New York, the Lieutenant Governor of the State of New York, New York State Senator Ranzenhofer, Assembly Member Hawley, Chair of the Batavia Downs/WROTB Board, Henry Wojtaszek, Senate Minority Leader Flanagan, Assembly Minority Leader Barclay, Senate President and Majority Leader Stewart-Cousins, Assembly Speaker Heastie.

Prior to the vote Legislator Clattenburg commented that the elimination of this revenue source is devastating to the City and County and the governor is denying funding for needed services. Legislator Deleo seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 111 RESOLUTION CALLING ON THE GOVERNOR AND STATE LEGISLATIVE LEADERS TO PROVIDE COUNTIES WITH PERMANENT LOCAL AUTHORITY OVER THEIR EXISTING SALES TAX

Offered by Legislator Young:

WHEREAS, like many counties in New York State, Genesee County continues to face significant challenges in balancing its budgets while also meeting the goals of the property tax cap; and

WHEREAS, the two primary revenue sources for Genesee County are its real property tax and local sales tax; and

WHEREAS, it is critically important for Genesee County to have confidence and stability in its revenue projections in order to efficiently and prudently develop its annual operating budgets, as

well as to develop and implement long-term capital and infrastructure plans; and

WHEREAS, the State has made the property tax cap permanent, therefore limiting a key county revenue in the face of rising costs and service needs in our community; and

WHEREAS, in recent years, five counties have seen their home rule revenue authority held hostage in unrelated state policy fights, resulting in the temporary lapse of local sales and mortgage recording tax collections; and

WHEREAS, NYSAC at its annual winter conference has continually asked for the same blanket current sales tax approval for all of the counties in New York State with Genesee presently being at 4%, and

WHEREAS, the loss of these revenues caused fiscal stress and budget uncertainty for these counties while increasing pressure on property tax rates, and this threat extends to all counties, including Genesee, under the current state sales tax renewal process; and

WHEREAS, in addition to addressing local quality of life services expected by its taxpayers, Genesee County must also administer and pay for more than 40 State and federal programs that regularly consume close to two thirds of its entire budget; and

WHEREAS, Genesee County's elected officials rely on their home rule authority to determine what balance of local taxes works best in their community; and

WHEREAS, New York City was granted permanent local authority over their sales tax rate a decade ago, while county requests for the same authority have been repeatedly denied; and

WHEREAS, Genesee County must share its sales tax revenues with its constituent city to help pay for services they deliver; and

WHEREAS, the pass-through of local sales tax revenue from Genesee County to its constituent city will likely exceed \$7 million in 2020; and

WHEREAS, it appears that all counties, including Genesee, will be further required to use some of their sales tax revenues to make up for the elimination of AIM funding to their constituent municipalities; and

WHEREAS, making Genesee County's existing local sales tax rate permanent would still allow for appropriate State legislative review in the future upon any change; and

WHEREAS, permanent home rule sales tax authority will provide more budget certainty and stability for counties, including Genesee; and

WHEREAS, permanent home rule sales tax authority at existing rates will reduce administrative expense and duplication of effort to process the necessary paperwork, forms, legislative hearings, filings and notices, resulting in improved government operations and fiscal savings at both the State and local levels; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, on recommendation of the Ways & Means Committee, That Genesee County calls upon the Governor and State Legislature to provide parity with New York City by granting permanent home rule sales tax authority to counties at their current tax rates; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the home rule process should be reformed so it works as efficiently as possible for local taxpayers and eliminates unnecessary and duplicative legislative activity at the State and local level, while retaining state legislative review; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature forward copies of this Resolution to Governor Andrew Cuomo, Temporary President of the Senate Andrea Stewart-Cousins, Senator Michael Ranzenhofer, Assembly Speaker Carl Heastie, Assembly Member Steve Hawley, Assembly Minority Leader Barclay, Senate Minority Leader Flanagan, Comptroller Tom DiNapoli.

Legislator Clattenburg made a motion to suspend the rules of the Genesee County Legislature to add a resolution that amends Resolution No. 147 of the Year 2016 seconded by Legislator Maha, carried unanimously. She further explained that the MEGA Executive Board approved resolutions to extend their agreements to October 31, 2020. The following resolution corrects the date from March 31, 2020 to October 31, 2020.

RESOLUTION NO. 115 AMEND RESOLUTION 147-2016/ AUTHORIZATION TO AMEND AND EXTEND EXISTING AGREEMENTS FOR ELECTRICITY, RENEWABLE ENERGY CREDITS, NATURAL GAS

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, on February 11, 2015, the Genesee County Legislature approved Resolution No. 2013-117, to issue an Invitation to Bid on behalf of the Municipal Electric and Gas Alliance for the supply of electricity and renewable energy credits for municipal and other customers located in National Grid, New York State Electric and Gas, and Rochester Gas and Electric utility territories, and an Invitation to Bid on behalf of the Municipal Electric and Gas Alliance for the supply of natural gas for municipal and other customers located National Grid, New York State Electric and Gas, Rochester Gas and Electric, National Fuel and Consolidated Edison utility territories, all in accordance with provisions of New York State Law, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 147 of year 2016 provided for a two-year extension of such agreements so they terminated on March 31, 2020, and

WHEREAS, Municipal Electric and Gas (MEGA) Executive Committee meet on March 25, 2016 and passed resolutions extending the Program Agreement with Direct Energy and Constellation for a term through October 31, 2020, and

WHEREAS, All political subdivisions and districts within the State of New York were authorized by the same resolution to participate in the contracts awarded as a result of this procurement, and

WHEREAS, Program Agreements with Constellation Energy Services for electricity supplies, and with Direct Energy Business for natural gas supplies were executed and implemented beginning April 1, 2015, and

WHEREAS, Market conditions have provided an opportunity for MEGA customers to benefit from current low pricing, and customers have expressed a desire to do so for longer than the present Agreements would otherwise provide, and

WHEREAS, Because such customer desires make it efficacious at this time to extend these Agreements as provided for in Paragraph 2.4 a) of such electricity agreement with Constellation, and in Paragraph 4.1 of such natural gas agreement with Direct Energy Business, it is the desire of the County, MEGA and the suppliers to do so, and

WHEREAS, MEGA has appropriately monitored both suppliers' performance under the agreement, found them to be exemplary, and has affirmed that suppliers' pricing will not be changed as a result of this proposed extension, and

WHEREAS, the MEGA board of Directors has formally requested the County to agree to a two-year extension of the existing agreements, as provided for in the Agreements and due to favorable market conditions and customer desires, now therefore be it.

RESOLVED, the Legislature hereby recommends the Chairman of the Genesee County Legislature approve the extension of the existing Program Agreements with Constellation Energy Services and Direct Energy in cooperation with MEGA, as appropriate to provide for a two-year extension of such Agreements so that they terminate October 31, 2020.

SEQR Action: Type II

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.
