FIFTH DAY GENESEE COUNTY LEGISLATURE Batavia, New York Wednesday, March 11, 2020

The Genesee Legislature met in Regular Session on Wednesday, March 11, 2020 at 5:30PM at the Old Courthouse 7 Main Street, Batavia, New York. Legislator Dibble assisted with the audit. Prayer was offered by Legislator Torrey followed by the Pledge to the Flag.

United Way 2020 Campaign Chairmen Jocelyn Sikorski & Steve Zimmer announced the County goal is \$21,500. All departments are encouraged to participate. United Way Coordinator Tammy Hathaway announced the overall goal is \$350,000.

Minutes of the February 20, 2020 Legislature Meeting were approved upon motion of Legislator Maha seconded by Legislator Dibble, carried unanimously.

Legislature Chair Stein commented that the Chamber of Commerce held their annual awards dinner and extended congratulations to award recipients Tompkins Bank of Castile, My-T-Acres/Call Family, Purple Pony Therapeutic and Crossroads Director Jeff Allen. County Manager Jay Gsell did a fine job as co-emcee of the event. The GO-ART! Decentralization grants were announced and given out GO-ART! to local artists and musicians. The Genesee County Economic Development Center hosted their annual meeting where business partnerships were recognized. Richmond Memorial Library unveiled their U.S. Census Responding Station. Lastly, she shared a planner position opening with Genesee Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council.

County Manager Jay Gsell stated he will attend Advocacy Day in Albany on March 25, 2020. He reminded those present of the fiscal impact of the US Census and that each person counted is approximately \$30,000 in grant funding and services.

Public Health Director Paul Pettit provided an update on COVID-19, Coronavirus, and emphasized we look at facts and stay away from rumor. He indicated his department is taking a calm and measured approach and has a response plan in place.

WHEREAS, The Director of Public Health did present a contract renewal for said services and the Committee on Human Services does concur. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute a contract with Monroe County for Tuberculosis Consultative and Educational Services for the Genesee County Health Department backdated to January 1, 2020 and continuing through December 31, 2020 at the following rates and not to exceed \$22,000 for the term of the contract:

WHEREAS, during contract negotiations the CSEA union proposed to add a Dental and Vision plan option in addition to the County sponsored plan at the sole expense of the union member, and

WHEREAS, as part of the ratification of the 2020-2023 CSEA union contract, the County agreed to permit the CSEA bargaining unit members and their dependents to enroll, at the sole expense of the member, in the Solstice Dental and Vision Plan. The cost of such coverage will be paid by each enrolled member by means of biweekly payroll deductions on a pre-tax basis. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute the agreement between CSEA Employee Benefit Fund, 1 Lear Jet Lane, Suite 1, Latham, NY 12110 and the County of Genesee to deduct biweekly payroll deductions from enrolled members at the rates and terms as outlined in the agreement, effective April 1, 2020. **Budget Impact**: No budget impact.

RESOLUTION NO. 131 AUTHORIZING CHAIRPERSON OF THE GENESEE COUNTY LEGISLATURE TO SIGN THE LETTER OF DIRECTION- ELIMINATING BARRIERS TO HOUSING IN NEW YORK PROGRAM – APPROVAL OF

Legislator Hilchey offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Genesee County is an eligible grantee under the Eliminating Barriers to Housing in New York (EBHNY) Program, and can either apply for the funding directly or direct its grant funding to an eligible subgrantee, and

WHEREAS, Genesee County does not intend on applying for grant funding under the EBHNY Program, and

WHEREAS, Housing Opportunities Made Equal, Inc. (HOME), an eligible grantee out of Erie County, NY, is requesting grant funding in an amount not to exceed \$1.2 million to support efforts to remove barriers to housing choice throughout the State of New York and to improve the housing stock to make it safe, decent, and affordable, as well as more accessible for people with disabilities, and

WHEREAS, HOME, Inc, currently serves residents in Genesee County, and this additional funding will only enhance this level of service. Now, therefore, Be it

WHEREAS, The Assistant County Manager and County Attorney have reviewed the contract and do recommend awarding a contract at this time, and

WHEREAS, The Ways and Means Committee did review this recommendation and does concur. Now, therefore, Be it

ABANDON PUBLIC USE OF A PORTION OF AG PARK WEST DRIVE AND APPROVE ITS SALE-COUNTY ATTORNEY

WHEREAS, the County of Genesee owns approximately 2.336 acres of land that has been previously dedicated by the County Legislature as a right-of-way forming an extension of Ag Park Drive West, that is currently being primarily used by the Highway Department as a second entrance to the highway buildings, and

WHEREAS, the County has received a Purchase and Sale Contract from UNC Real Estate II, LLC (hereinafter "Purchaser") to buy approximately 1 acre of the aforesaid 2.336 acres for the price of \$50,000 per acre, based upon an instrument survey to be obtained and paid for by the Purchaser, and

WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent has recommended the sale since this 1 acre parcel is not essential to County use since the Highway buildings can be accessed from the main entrance that was used before the County's acquisition of the 2.336 acres in 2014, and

WHEREAS, at the request of the Highway Superintendent the Purchaser has agreed to enter into a proposed "License Agreement" which allows the County to retain the use of the sale area, with the duty to continue to repair and maintain the same, until such time as the purchaser provides 90 days prior notice to the County that the license permission will be terminated, and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney, Highway Superintendent, County Manager and Assistant County Manager have reviewed both the Purchase and Sale Contract and the License Agreement and recommend approval of the same, and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Ways and Means did review this request and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED: that the County Legislature does hereby determine that the approximate 1 acre portion of the 2.336 acres of land owned by the County, which is currently being used as a right-of-way as part of Ag Park West Drive, is no longer necessary for public use, and Be it is further **RESOLVED:** that a "Purchase and Sale Contract for Lots, Vacant Land and Farms", signed by the Purchaser on February 18, 2020, is hereby approved to sell the approximate 1 acre parcel of land to the Purchaser for the price of \$50,000 per acre, and the Chair of the Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute this Contract on behalf of the County; together with such other and further documents that are necessary to complete the transfer, and Be it further

RESOLVED: that a proposed "License Agreement" executed on behalf of the Purchaser is hereby approved and the Chair of the Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute this License Agreement on behalf of the County.

RESOLUTION NO. 136 RESOLUTION CALLING ON THE GOVERNOR AND NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATURE TO PRESERVE THE ZERO PERCENT MEDICAID GROWTH CAP FOR ALL COUNTIES AND NEW YORK CITY

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, Genesee County adopts and endorses the resolution adopted by the New York State Association of Counties at their 2020 Legislative Conference on January 29, 2020; and

WHEREAS, spending in New York state for Medicaid is the single largest expense in the State budget; and

WHEREAS, the funding to support the Medicaid program is provided by a combination of federal, state and local resources; and

WHEREAS, the required county and New York City contribution is \$7.6 billion annually; and WHEREAS, the local share of Medicaid funding paid in New York is the highest of any state in the country and is more than what 43 individual states pay in <u>state</u> share for their Medicaid programs; and WHEREAS, this large local funding share for Medicaid and other state programs is a major contributor to New York's high local tax burden compared to other states; and

WHEREAS, the Governor and legislative leaders recognize the fiscal burden the financing of Medicaid is for local taxpayers and initiated steps to relieve part of that burden by capping the growth in local costs in this program; and

WHEREAS, one of the most prominent property tax reduction and mandate relief initiatives in state history was Governor Cuomo's establishment of the zero percent Medicaid growth cap; and

WHEREAS, this zero percent growth cap enables counties to keep funding for the growing cost of many vital state programs and services, while continuing local quality of life services demanded by taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the Medicaid budget is facing billions of dollars in annual deficits over the next several years; and

WHEREAS, these Medicaid deficits are contributing to the largest budget deficit the state has faced since the Great Recession; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Executive Budget Recommendation is proposing a variety of ways to address these combined fiscal shortfalls; and

WHEREAS, budget proposals advanced by the Governor rely on \$150 million in Medicaid program costs assumed by local taxpayers; and include:

- Using county government federal enhanced medicaid match savings;
- Losing state Medicaid growth cap if counties breach the state property tax cap;
- Shifting the local share of Medicaid growth above 3% to counties, if counties cannot contain costs under 3%; and

WHEREAS, counties do not have tools to control the Medicaid program growth; some of these limitations include:

- The ability to audit the Medicaid program;
- The ability to control the cost of perscription drugs;
- The ability to set provider reimbursement rates;
- The ability to modify eligiblity and benefit levels for Medicaid recipients;
- The ability to control changing demographics across the state;
- The ability to control provider contracts; and

WHEREAS, if state experts in the Medicaid program are unable to develop solutions to control growth in the Medicaid program, it will be difficult for counties to do so, since they do not have this authority to control costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Legislature urges the Governor and legislative leaders to maintain the zero percent Medicaid growth cap for counties and New York City as they address state budget shortfalls in order to keep downward pressure on the local tax burden; and **RE IT FURTUER DESOLVED** that appias of this resolution he cont to Course Andrew M. Curse

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, the New York State Legislature, and all others deemed necessary and proper.
