The Genesee County Legislature met in Regular Session on Wednesday, March 13, 2024 at 5:30 PM in the Legislative Chambers of the Old Courthouse.

Legislator Deleo offered to assist with the audit, the prayer and the Pledge to the Flag.

Madam Chair Stein called for a moment of silence in honor of Sergeant Thomas A. Sanfratello of the Sheriff's Office. Chair Stein announced the following: Thomas A. Sanfratello passed away at age 54 on March 10, 2024 in the line of duty, while serving and protecting the citizens of Genesee County, New York, Thomas was born in Batavia New York to Anthony and Dorothy Sanfratello. He graduated from Alexander Central School; He completed his Paramedic Certification while being an active member of the Alexander Fire Department. Thomas's career with the Genesee County Sheriff's Office as a dispatcher. Thomas was appointed as a Deputy Sheriff and attended the Erie County Law Enforcement Academy, 88th class. He was promoted to Road Patrol Sergeant. Thomas was twice awarded Deputy of the Year, and awarded several commendations over the years. Thomas was heavily involved with the New York State Sheriffs Association, Stop DWI, and shop with a cop. Thomas was a Town Board Member for the Town of Alexander. He was an avid fan of the New York Yankees and a huge Buffalo Sabres fan. He loved spending time with his family, especially his children. Thomas is survived by his mother; children Ian, Kyla, and Alexis Sanfratello;, their mothers; sisters, nieces and nephews; his Partner, 2 great nieces, 2 great nephews, along with many cousins, countless friends. He also leaves his brothers and sisters in law enforcement. Calling hours will be held at the Call Arena at Genesee Community College, 1 Batavia NY 14020. An 11:00AM Funeral Service will be held at the same location on Saturday March 16, 2024 with a burial at St. Joseph's Cemetery. This legislature body mourns his loss. WHEREAS, the Genesee County Treasurer is recommending three budget amendments in order to close the books for 2023, and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Ways and Means concurs with the County Treasurer's recommendations. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2023 budget by:

Increasing Expense A.9904.9000.0002 Transfers to Liability in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 and Increase Revenue A.1000.1110 Sales Tax in a like amount; Increase Expense MS.1930.4640.1020 Misc. Litigation Expense in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 and Increase Revenue MS.1930.5031 Interfund transfers in a like amount.

Increase Expense A.1985.4800.0000 Distribution of Sales Tax in the amount of \$867,632.00 and Increase Revenue A.1000.1110 Sales Tax in a like amount.

Increase Expense MS.1710.4800.4 Medical Claims in the amount of \$650,000.00 and Increase Revenue MS. 9060.2770.3 Pharmacy Rebate in a like amount.

Budget Impact: The first amendment increases the use of sales tax by \$1,000,000 in order to increase the liability reserve. The other two amendments have no budget impact, these are needed to close the 2023 books.

RESOLUTION NO. 105

SALARY SCHEDULE AMENDMENT-MENTAL HEALTH/CLINICAL THERAPIST- APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Director of the Community Mental Health Services is requesting an amendment to the 2024 Employee's Salary Schedule to eliminate one Mental Health Clinical Social Worker, CSEA, Grade 19M and create one Mental Health Clinical Therapist, CSEA, Grade 19M. This change would allow a larger pool of candidates with different degrees to qualify for the vacancy, and

WHEREAS, the Committees on Human Services and Ways and Means did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Treasurer and the Human Resources Director is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2024 Employee's Salary Schedule by eliminating one full-time Mental Health Clinical Social Worker, CSEA, Grade 19M and creating one full-time Mental Health Clinical Therapist, CSEA, Grade 19M effective March 14, 2024.

Budget Impact: No budget amendment due to the positions being the same grade within the salary schedule.

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 182 (Maha absent-18) votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 106

SALARY SCHEDULE AMENDMENT – OFFICE FOR THE AGING/NUTRITION PROJECT MEAL SITE ASSISTANT-APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Director of the Office for the Aging did request to increase the hours of an existing Nutrition Project Meal Site Assistant from 24 hours to 32 hours biweekly, to provide coverage for established congregate meal sites serving 4 days per week, and

WHEREAS, the Committees on Human Services and Ways and Means did review this recommendation and recommends approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Treasurer and Human Resources Director are hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2024 Genesee County Employees' Salary Schedule by increasing hours from 24 hours biweekly to 32 hours biweekly for the Nutrition Project Meal Site Assistant, CSEA Grade 3, effective March 14th, 2024.

Budget Impact: Increased cost (including both salary and fringe) total is \$3,368 and is offset by a vacant position with the same title. All expenditures related to this position are fully funded with federal and state aid from IIIC1 and will not change the current county match amounts which are in the adopted 2024 budget.

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 182 (Maha absent-18) votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 107

STATE AID ACCEPTANCE /BUDGET AMENDMENT-PUBLIC HEALTH/ PERFORMANCE INCENTIVE PROGRAM -APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Public Health Department participated in the 2023 Local Health Department Performance Incentive Program and completed the reporting requirements during the performance period (January 1, 2023 – July 31, 2023), and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Health has awarded the Genesee County Public Health Department \$12,849 to use this funding to support costs associated with Article 6 eligible services, and

WHEREAS, the Committees on Human Services and Ways and Means did review this award and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized to accept this award for \$12,849 as specified in the Local Health Department Incentive Program description, Be it further

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2024 4010 Health Department budget to reflect an increase of: \$12,849 in Appropriations A4010 4800.0000 Program Expense, to be offset by an increase of \$12,849 in A4010 3401 State Aid, Public Health.

Budget Impact: \$0 cost to the county, funds will be used to support costs associated with any Article 6 State Aid eligible activity or supplies.

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 182 (Maha absent-18) votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 108

GRANT AMENDMENT -PUBLIC HEALTH/ COVID-19 GRANT - APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Health has extended the Genesee County Public Health Departments \$1,601,284 COVID-19 Enhanced Detection grant until 07/31/2024, and

WHEREAS, the Committees on Human Services and Ways and Means did review this Grant amendment and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute an amendment to the agreement with the NYS Department of Health to extend the end date

of the COVID-19 Enhanced Detection Grant until 07/31/2024.

Budget Impact: Funds are allocated in the 2024 4010 Public Health Department budget.

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 182 (Maha absent-18) votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 109

WORKER RETENTION PAYMENT – PUBLIC HEALTH/INFRASTRUCTURE, WORKFORCE & DATA SYSTEMS GRANT - APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Public Health Department accepted funding (2023 resolution #289) from the Center for Disease Control & Prevention. The purpose of the PH Infrastructure, Workforce & Data Systems Grant is to address long-standing weaknesses due to chronic underinvestment in New York's public health system and strengthens preparedness to address new challenges and to better meet the ongoing and future public health needs of New Yorkers, and

WHEREAS, the Public Health Department continues to experience high rates of turnover and vacancies due to employees leaving for alternative employment, and

WHEREAS, to entice employees to remain in their employment with the County, the Public Health Department is using funds from the PH Infrastructure, Workforce & Data Systems grant to provide a worker retention payment in the amount of \$3,000 for the Genesee County Public Health Department hourly employees and \$4,000 for the Genesee County Public Health Department Management employees. The total amount of \$3,000 for hourly employees and \$4,000 for Management employees will be paid in (2) equal payments. The first payment being on May 17th, 2024 and the second payment on November 15th, 2024, and

WHEREAS, the Committees on Human Services and Ways and Means is in agreement and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Treasurer and Human Resource Director are hereby authorized and directed to provide worker retention payments to eligible employees using the following criteria; hourly employees who work 30 hours or more per week shall receive a retention payment of \$3,000 and management employees who work 30 hours or more per week shall receive a retention payment of \$4,000. Be it further

RESOLVED, that to be eligible for the retention payments, an employee shall be employed as of April 30th, 2024 for the payment on May17th, 2024 and an employee shall be employed as of October 31st, 2024 for the payment on November 15th, 2024.

Budget Impact: All expenses for the retention payments are included in the 2024 4010 budget and are offset by the PH Infrastructure, Workforce & Data Systems Grant funds, with no cost to the County. The total estimated amount of retention payments with fringe is \$117,464.

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 182 (Maha absent-18) votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 110

BOARD REAPPOINTMENT – DSS (YOUTH BUREAU)/MARCH - APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Kelly March's City of Batavia seat on the Genesee County Youth Advisory Board is expiring March 31, 2024. Ms. March has requested to be reappointed to the Board, and

WHEREAS, the Committees on Human Service and Ways and Means do recommend this reappointment to the Genesee County Youth Advisory Board at this time. Now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the Genesee County Department of Social Services does possess eighteen (18) tables for employee use, and

WHEREAS, the tables in question are no longer needed in this department and no other department has shown interest in their use, and

WHEREAS, the Committees of Human Service and Ways and Means did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Purchasing Director is hereby authorized to dispose of the eighteen (18) surplus tables by the method deemed most appropriate by that department.

Budget Impact: Should the tables sell at auction, the proceeds would either go to the county's fund or would be attributed as revenue in the DSS budget under A.6010.1810.1.

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 182 (Maha absent-18) votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 112

DISPOSITION OF WORTHLESS PROPERTY – SOCIAL SERVICES - APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Genesee County Department of Social Services did purchase seventeen (17) computer chairs for employee use and three (3) guest chairs for public use at the department, and

WHEREAS, the chairs in question can no longer be utilized for their intended use due to damage and can no longer be salvaged for parts, and

WHEREAS, the Committees of Human Service and Ways and Means did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Purchasing Director is hereby authorized to dispose of the twenty (20) worthless chairs by the method deemed most appropriate by that department.

Budget Impact: There is no budgetary impact associated with this resolution.

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 182 (Maha absent-18) votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 113

2024 EMPLOYEE SALARY SCHEDULE AMENDMENT-DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES/YOUTH BUREAU FULL-TIME YOUTH PROGRAM ASSISTANT/CHILD CARE WORKER-APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, a part-time Youth Program Assistant position and a part-time Youth Program Coordinator position within the Youth Bureau at the Department of Social Services are currently vacant due to employee resignations, and

WHEREAS, there is no longer a need for two (2) part-time positions within the Youth Bureau, the Commissioner of Social Services is requesting an amendment to the 2024 Employee Salary Schedule to create one (1) full-time Youth Program Assistant/Child Care Worker position to cover these duties, and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Human Service and Ways and Means did review this request and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Treasurer and Human Resources Director are hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2024 Employee Salary Schedule by eliminating the current part-time Youth Program Assistant and part-time Youth Program Coordinator positions within the Youth Bureau and create the full-time Youth Program Assistant/Child Care Worker position, CSEA Grade 9, effective immediately upon legislative approval.

Budget Impact: The part-time CSEA Grade 9 Youth Program Assistant position (232-002) and the part-time CSEA Grade 15 Youth Program Coordinator position (276-003) in the 2024 budget are both vacant. Both positions will be eliminated to create the new full-time position using the Grade 9 Youth Program Assistant starting pay rate of \$20.11/hour. The part-time Coordinator position is

budgeted for \$66,743.40 and the part-time Assistant position is budgeted for \$24,256.28 in the 2024 budget, totaling \$90,999.68. The total cost of the newly created position will be \$73,567.78 for calendar year 2024. State and Federal reimbursement ranges between 62-100% as determined by case specific eligibility.

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 182 (Maha absent-18) votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 114

ADVOCATE ON BEHALF OF SUNY COMMUNITY COLLEGES TO INCREASE FUNDING TO COMMUNITY COLLEGES IN THE STATE BUDGET – APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, State University of New York's (SUNY's) community colleges serve the largest percentage of low income, historically marginalized populations, and working adults of all SUNY sectors, and

WHEREAS, the state's direct tax support for SUNY's community colleges is lower than it was a decade ago, has not increased in three years, and has fallen behind the NY state counties' direct tax support to community colleges by \$97 million, and

WHEREAS, the community college sector Trustees and Presidents and SUNY Adirondack advocated for New York State to meet its obligation to equally share its support of the community colleges with the counties, and

WHEREAS, increasing base operating aid by \$97 million will bring the state's share of direct state tax support for operating aid to equal that of New York's counties and support training 20,000 New Yorkers in high demand jobs through the Empire

WHEREAS, with no increase to base operating aid, community colleges will be unable to meet the workforce needs appropriately and substantially of New York State and Genesee County, particularly in healthcare, semi-conductor manufacturing, IT, and regionally based industry sectors, and

WHEREAS, our county has faithfully carried out our fiduciary duties. Now, therefore, be it **RESOLVED**, that the Genesee County Legislature urges New York State Legislators to advocate on behalf of the community college sector of SUNY by ensuring that NYS meets its fiduciary obligation to equally share its financial support of the community colleges with the counties by adding an additional \$97 million in operating base aid for the community colleges as requested. Be it further,

RESOLVED, that the Chairperson of the Genesee County Legislature hereby is authorized to forward advocacy letters to Governor Kathy Hochul, New York State Senator George Borrello, New York State Assemblyman Stephen Hawley, Education Chair Chancellor of SUNY John B. King, Jr., New York State Association of Counties, Inter-County Association of Western New York and any other deemed necessary.

Legislator Dibble seconded the resolution, which was adopted by 182 (Maha absent-18) votes.

CONTRACT RENEWAL-MENTAL HEALTH/ARC GLOW 2024 - APPROVAL OF
