Budget Impact: Annual revenue of approximately \$10,300 received from this agreement will offset the cost of providing the requested tax collection services.

WHEREAS, the Public Service and Ways & Means Committees did review this request and do recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Undersheriff is hereby authorized and directed to complete the online attestation form to accept the DCJS LETECH grant funding for fiscal year 2024-2025 in the amount of \$167,000, and be it further

WHEREAS, the Opioid Task Force received funding requests from the Genesee County Sheriff's Office to fund the purchase of 3 Automated External Defibrillators (AED's) to equip patrol vehicles and a Thermo Scientific TruNarc Analyzer to rapidly identify drugs and reduce the handling of potential harmful drugs by Sheriff's Deputies, and

WHEREAS, the Opioid Task Force has reviewed the requests and recommends allocating \$5,524 for the purchase of three AED's and \$30,360 for the purchase and training of a TruNarc Analyzer system, and

WHEREAS, the Committee of Pubic Service and Ways and Means did review this request and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2024 budget by increasing A.3110.4800.0600 – Sheriff, Program Expense – Opioid Settlement Expense by \$35,884, offset by an increase in A.3110.2735 Opioid Settlement in the amount of \$35,884 with monies coming from A688.1 Other Liabilities – Opioid Settlement

Budget Impact: total cost of request = \$35,884. Balance of Other Liabilities fund after this purchase = \$542,439

2024-2025 GRANT ACCEPTANCE–GENESEE JUSTICE/NYS DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE SERVICES ATI GRANT–APPROVAL OF

WHEREAS, the Program Coordinator has requested that the County accept this funding which stipulates that this revenue will be used to support the Genesee Justice ATI Program, and

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute the necessary form for the application and acceptance of funds for the period of July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, in the amount of \$41,876, and to execute any and all other documentation related to this funding.

Budget Impact: There is no change to A 3151 3320 (State Aid-Community Service) as monies were already anticipated at noted levels in our 2024 County Budget.

WHEREAS, the Committee on Public Service and Ways and Means did review this, and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Legislature does hereby authorize and direct Bradley Mazur, Genesee County Undersheriff, Diana Prinzi, Genesee Justice Program Coordinator, Diana Fox, Director of the Office for the Aging, and Kevin Finnell, District Attorney to sign the YWCA Memorandum of Understanding. RESOLVED, that upon notification of grant award; a grant acceptance and budget amendment Resolution will be presented to the Legislature for further action.

Budget Impact: Neutral. The YWCA MOU does not establish any financial liability for any of the parties.

WHEREAS, the JFCAC Program Coordinator did request an amendment to the Agreement to include reimbursement to Medical Director Coyne for one third of the cost of medical malpractice insurance, totaling \$1,368.00, annually, fully covered by grants from the NYS Office of Victim Services, and

WHEREAS, the Committees of Public Service & Ways and Means did review this request and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature and the Genesee County Sheriff are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Amended Agreement with John F. Coyne, M.D., F.A.A.P., with residence at 1215 Backus Road, Derby, NY 14047, to include reimbursement to Mr. Coyne for one third of the cost of medical malpractice insurance, totaling \$1,368.00, annually, fully covered by grants from the NYS Office of Victim Services.

Budget Impact: No impact on County Budget. Funds for reimbursement of medical malpractice insurance are fully covered by grants from the NYS Office of Victim Services and are already included in the 2024 Justice for Children Advocacy Center budget.

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature and Sheriff are hereby authorized to enter into the renewal agreement with PrimeCare Medical of NY (located at 3940 Locust Lane, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania 17109) to provide medical services at the Genesee County Jail for January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024, at a monthly cost not to exceed \$65,412.71 with the option to renew for four (4) additional one-year periods upon mutual, written consent by both parties.

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Legislature does hereby approve of the sponsor's share of the operating budget of the Genesee Community College for the fiscal year September 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025 in the amount of \$2,836,374 and cause the same to be included in the County Tax levy for the year 2024.

Budget Impact: the current Genesee County operating budget for Genesee Community College has been proposed in the amount of \$2,836,374 which would result in a \$50,000 increase from the last fiscal year.

WHEREAS, the Coordinator of Emergency Management Services has proposed a modification to the agencies' name to clarify and more accurately depict the services provided to all first responders and to the citizens of Genesee County, and

WHEREAS, the Committee of Ways and Means has reviewed this request and recommends adopting the proposed changes. Now therefore be it,

RESOLVED, that the Genesee County Legislature does hereby authorize the name change from Genesee County Emergency Management Services (EMS) to Genesee County Office of Emergency Management (OEM), and be it further
