THIRTEENTH DAY GENESEE COUNTY LEGISLATURE Batavia, New York Wednesday, July 28, 2021

The Genesee County Legislature met in Regular Session on Wednesday, June 23, 2021 at 5:30 PM in the Legislative Chambers of the Old Courthouse. Legislator Clattenburg assisted with the audit. The prayer was offered by Legislator Yunker followed by the Pledge to the Flag.

Minutes of the June 23, 2021 Legislature meeting were approved upon motion of Legislator Maha seconded by Legislator Dibble, carried unanimously.

Legislature Chair Stein commented on an upcoming opportunity to provide testimony on the redistricting process. U.S. Census numbers are expected to result in the loss of two New York congressional seats and Genesee County could be carved up. Details and additional information will be provided.

County Manager Matt Landers stated he has fielded questions in light of the Governor's announcement that State employees will be required to be vaccinated or tested for COVID regularly effective the first week of September. The County has not adopted that policy but continues to require employees and visitors who are not vaccinated to wear a mask and practice social distancing.

The Clerk proceeded with the resolutions:

RESOLUTION NO. 280 ESTABLISH CAPITAL PROJECT & BUDGET AMENDMENT - OFFICE FOR THE AGING APPROVAL OF

Legislator Deleo offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Office for the Aging received notice of grant award (NGA) by the American Rescue Plan (ARP) in the amount of \$233,004, and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Office for the Aging is requesting to establish a capital project for the development of improving the service delivery for the Office for the Aging by refiguring and adding additional office spaces, improving the appearance of several programming areas of the building with carpeting and paint, replacing the dishwasher and garbage disposal, adding needed furnishings, equipment, and subscriptions for client use to enhance and expand programs in the amount of \$64,416 utilizing the "ARP" funds, and

WHEREAS, The Committees on Human Services and Ways and Means did review this request and recommends approval at this time. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, The Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to establish a capital project named Office for the Aging Property Improvements in the amount of \$64,416 funded by the ARP and be it, further

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Treasurer hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2021 budget by Increasing Appropriation H.1997.2080.0000 Capital Expense in the amount of \$64,416 and Increasing Revenue H.1997.4089.3 Federal Aid in a like amount.

Budget Impact Statement: Increases capital expenses by \$64,416 and is offset completely by federal aid. The balance of the funds will be spent in other resolutions.

Budget Impact Statement: Neutral. Some of the expenses are offset by existing vacant positions, and the NGA covers the rest of the increases in salary, medical, FICA and retirement and is not expected to impact the adopted 2021 county budget or change county share. The end date for the additional positions is 2024. Incorporating the balance of the \$233,004 into the budgets of 2022-2024. There is a 10-25% match requirement that is met by county overmatch. Per NYSOFA Director it is anticipated that this required match was an oversite and will be eliminated.
