Wednesday, January 11, 2017

The Genesee County Legislature met in Regular Session on Wednesday, January 11, 2017 at 5:30PM at the Old Courthouse 7 Main Street, Batavia, New York. Legislator Stein assisted with the audit. Prayer was offered by Legislator Deleo followed by the Pledge to the Flag.

In addition to our regular meeting Chairman Cianfrini opened a **Public Hearing** on Local Law Introductory No. One Year 2017, A Local Law in relation to the salaries of county officers of the county of Genesee, Elected or Appointed for a fixed term. All interested parties were invited to be heard.

Chairman Cianfrini formally welcomed the new County Attorney Kevin Earl by presenting his printed name plate.

The December 14, 2016 and December 30, 2016 meeting minutes were approved upon motion of Legislator Stein seconded by Legislator Bausch, carried unanimously.

Legislator Stein reported the Ag & Farmland Protection Board has a draft of the final plan being drawn up by the consulting firm Wendel. Chairman Cianfrini announced the Chamber of Commerce is hosting an open house at their new address on Park road from 5-7 PM on January 12, 2017. Mr. Cianfrini also suggested legislators look for news from NYSAC regarding a vote in Greene County on a proposed \$52M jail.

Legislator Bausch commented on the Governor's comments made recently during a stop in Western New York stating they were insulting to individuals who serve on local boards and legislatures particularly in light of his veto of the Indigent Defense bill. He also stated that the Governor, as far as he knows, has only stopped in once to the NYSAC Legislative conference.

Legislator DeJaneiro stated that he sees many policies as being well thought out and this is not a Democrat/Republican issue but a fiscal issue.

County Manager Jay Gsell reported that he attended the local presentation of Gov. Cuomo's State of the State and noted a quote used by the Governor which was from Governor Roosevelt in 1932. He also explained Counties are being asked to provide the Governor with a consolidation plan.

RESOLUTION NO. 3 RENEWAL OF CONTRACT – OFA/TENDER LOVING FAMILY CARE – APPROVAL OF

Legislator Torrey offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Director of the Office for the Aging did present a renewal of contract resulting from RFP 2014-111 which took effect January 1, 2015 renewable for four (4) one-year (1) periods upon mutual, written consent of both parties and in the best interest of Genesee County for the provision of in-home health care needs to senior citizens for the NYS Expanded In-Home Services for the Elderly Program, the New York State Elder Caregiver Support Respite Care Program, and the New York State Department of Health Western New York Alzheimer's Caregiver Collaborative Grant; and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Human Services did review this request and does recommend approval of this contract at this time. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute the necessary documents to award a contract with Tender Loving Family Care, Inc. 122 West Avenue, Brockport, NY 14420 for the provision of in-home health care at a rate of \$27.00 per hour for Housekeeping/Chore (PC Level 1); \$30.00 per hour for Personal Care/Homecare (PC Level 2) and \$157.00 per visit for Aide/Nursing Supervision; or the 2017 Medicaid approved rate for Tender Loving Family Care (TLFC) or, if TLFC does not set rates with NYSDOH, rates not to exceed the highest rate authorized for any licensed home care agencies established for Genesee County by NYSDOH (whichever is less); not to exceed \$120,000 for the period January 1, 2017 – December 31, 2017. Tender Loving Family Care, Inc. does not have 2016 established Medicaid rates for Genesee County. The actual 2017 Medicaid rates are not known at this time. Therefore, the highest established Genesee County most currently approved (2016) NYSDOH Medicaid rates are set at \$26.91 per hour for Housekeeping/Chore (PC Level 1), \$29.99 per hour for Personal Care/Homecare (PC Level 2) and \$156.68 per visit for Nursing Supervision, but are subject to change based on NYSDOH rate

setting adjustments; will be extended into 2017 until new Medicaid rates are established. If actual 2017 approved Medicaid rate is less than the RFP proposed renewal rate, the rate charged for 2017 would be the lower of the two and would be applied retroactively back to January 1, 2017.

<u>Budget Impact</u>: Total contract for 2017 not to exceed \$120,000 and is included in the 2017 county budget. Legislator DeJaneiro seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 4 AWARD OF CONTRACT – OFA/COMMUNITY CARE OF WESTERN NEW YORK – APPROVAL OF

Legislator Stein offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Director of the Office for the Aging did present a renewal of contract resulting from RFP 2014-111 which took effect January 1, 2015 renewable for four (4) one-year (1) periods for the provision of in-home health care needs to senior citizens for the NYS Expanded In-Home Services for the Elderly Program, the New York State Elder Caregiver Support Respite Care Program, and the New York State Department of Health Western New York Alzheimer's Caregiver Collaborative Grant; and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Human Services did review this request and does recommend approval of this contract at this time. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to execute the necessary documents to award a contract with Community Care of Western New York, Inc. dba Home Care & Hospice, 1225 W. State Street, Olean, NY 14760 for the provision of in-home health care at the at a rate of \$25.35 per hour for Housekeeping/Chore (PC Level 1); \$25.67 per hour for Personal Care/Homecare (PC Level 2); and \$85.07 for Nursing Supervision; or the 2017 Medicaid approved rate for Community Care of WNY or, if Community Care of WNY does not set rates with New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), rates not to exceed the highest rate authorized for any licensed home care agencies established for Genesee County by the NYSDOH (whichever is less); not to exceed \$120,000 for the period January 1, 2017 – December 31, 2017. Currently, 2016 established rates for Community Care of Western New York are set at \$25.35 per hour for Housekeeping/Chore (PC Level 1), \$25.67 per hour for Personal Care/Homecare (PC Level 2) and \$85.07 per visit for Nursing Supervision, but are subject to change based on NYSDOH rate setting adjustments). The actual 2017 Medicaid rates are not known at this time; so if actual 2017 approved Medicaid rate is less than the RFP proposed renewal rate, the rate charged for 2017 would be the lower of the two and would be applied retroactively back to January 1, 2017.

<u>Budget Impact</u>: Total contract for 2017 not to exceed \$120,000 and is included in the 2017 county budget. Legislator Deleo seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 5 APPOINTMENT – GENESEE COUNTY YOUTH BOARD APPROVAL OF

WHEREAS, A Memorandum of Agreement has been prepared between the County of Genesee and the Cornell Cooperative Extension Association of Genesee County for the expenditure of funds appropriated in the 2017 Genesee County Budget in the amount of \$338,548. Now, therefore, Be it RESOLVED, That the Chair of the Genesee County Legislature be and hereby is authorized and directed to execute said Memorandum of Agreement between the County of Genesee and Cornell Cooperative Extension Association of Genesee County for the year 2017 in the amount of \$338,548.

RESOLUTION NO. 7

AGREEMENT RENEWAL WITH HOLLAND PURCHASE HISTORICAL SOCIETY FOR OPERATION OF HOLLAND LAND OFFICE MUSEUM - APPROVAL OF

Legislator Torrey offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Holland Land Office Museum is a registered National Historic Landmark and serves as a history museum housing the collections of the Holland Purchase Historical Society for the purpose of preserving, displaying and interpreting the history and culture of the County of Genesee, and

WHEREAS, The Genesee County Legislature in 1999 divested the County from the day-to-day operation of a County History Museum by allowing the Holland Purchase Historical Society to assume this responsibility, and

WHEREAS, The Genesee County Manager did present a proposed agreement with the Holland Purchase Historical Society for the continuation of their services, and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Human Services has reviewed this agreement and does recommend approval of said agreement at this time. Now, therefore Be it

RESOLVED, That the Chairman of the Genesee County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to enter into agreement with the Holland Purchase Historical Society, Inc. for the purpose of presenting programs of historical events and concern and for maintaining and operating a public museum for the period January 1, 2017, through December 31, 2017 at an annual cost of \$33,554.

Prior to the vote, Legislator Stein restated her position of non-support due to the lack of information from the Holland Land Office Museum. Legislator Clattenburg stated she thought

that if the Legislature is going to divest of this support to this agency, they must be consistent and divest of all support to outside agencies and groups. Chairman Cianfrini stated he questions if the County should continue to own the building and it has become a luxury we can no longer afford. He stated he will support operations for one more year.

Legislator DeJaneiro seconded the resolution which was adopted by 283 votes Legislator Stein No (43).

RESOLUTION NO. 8 AMENDMENT – 2017 TAX WARRANTS – APPROVAL OF Legislator Stein offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 501 of the year 2016 adopted by the Genesee County Legislature established Town Tax Warrants for the various Towns within Genesee County, and

WHEREAS, After the adoption of said resolution an error was discovered on the summary page of the Town of LeRoy's budget that showed the amount to be raised for the Town of LeRoy Water District as \$27,200 when in fact that amount should have read \$24,243.50. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That Resolution No. 501-16 be amended as follows:

Budget Impact: The Town of LeRoy warrant is decreased by \$2,956.50. This amount is retained by the Town of LeRoy, so there is no impact to the County.

Legislator Deleo seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 9 REAL PROPERTY TAX CORRECTIONS AND REFUNDS 2017 – TREASURER – APPROVAL OF

Legislator Clattenburg offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The New York State Real Property Tax Law §554 and §556, provide an administrative correction of errors process to assist the property owner in obtaining real property tax corrections and refunds caused by certain clerical errors, unlawful entries, and errors in essential fact, and

WHEREAS, The tax levying body can delegate, by resolution on an annual basis, the authority to perform the duties of the tax levying body in regard to Real Property Tax Law §554 and Real Property Tax Law §556, and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Ways and Means does recommend that the Treasurer be delegated to perform said duties. Now, therefore Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Treasurer be and hereby is authorized and directed to carry out the requirements of §554 and §556 of the Real Property Tax Law, effective immediately, where the Real Property Tax Director's recommended correction or refund is two thousand five hundred dollars or less, and Be it further

RESOLVED, That on the fifteenth day of each month, the Genesee County Treasurer shall submit a report to the Genesee County Legislature of the corrections and refunds processed during the preceding month containing the name of each recipient, the location of the property, the reason for the correction or refund, and the amount of the correction or refund.

Budget Impact: No immediate impact, correction and refund amounts will vary from year to year. Refunds are charged to allowance for uncollectible which has a balance of approximately \$103,067.

Legislator Stein seconded the resolution which was adopted by 326 votes.

RESOLUTION NO. 10 REAPPOINTMENTS – STOP-DWI ADVISORY BOARD – APPROVAL OF

Legislator Young offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The term of office has expired for Jocelyn Sikorski, citizen member of the STOP-DWI Advisory Board and she has indicated a desire and ability to continue service, and

WHEREAS, The Committee on Ways and Means does recommend the reappointment of citizen Jocelyn Sikorski. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That Jocelyn Sikorski of Alexander, New York be reappointed as citizen members of the Genesee County STOP-DWI Advisory Board to serve another term effective immediately through December 31, 2019.
